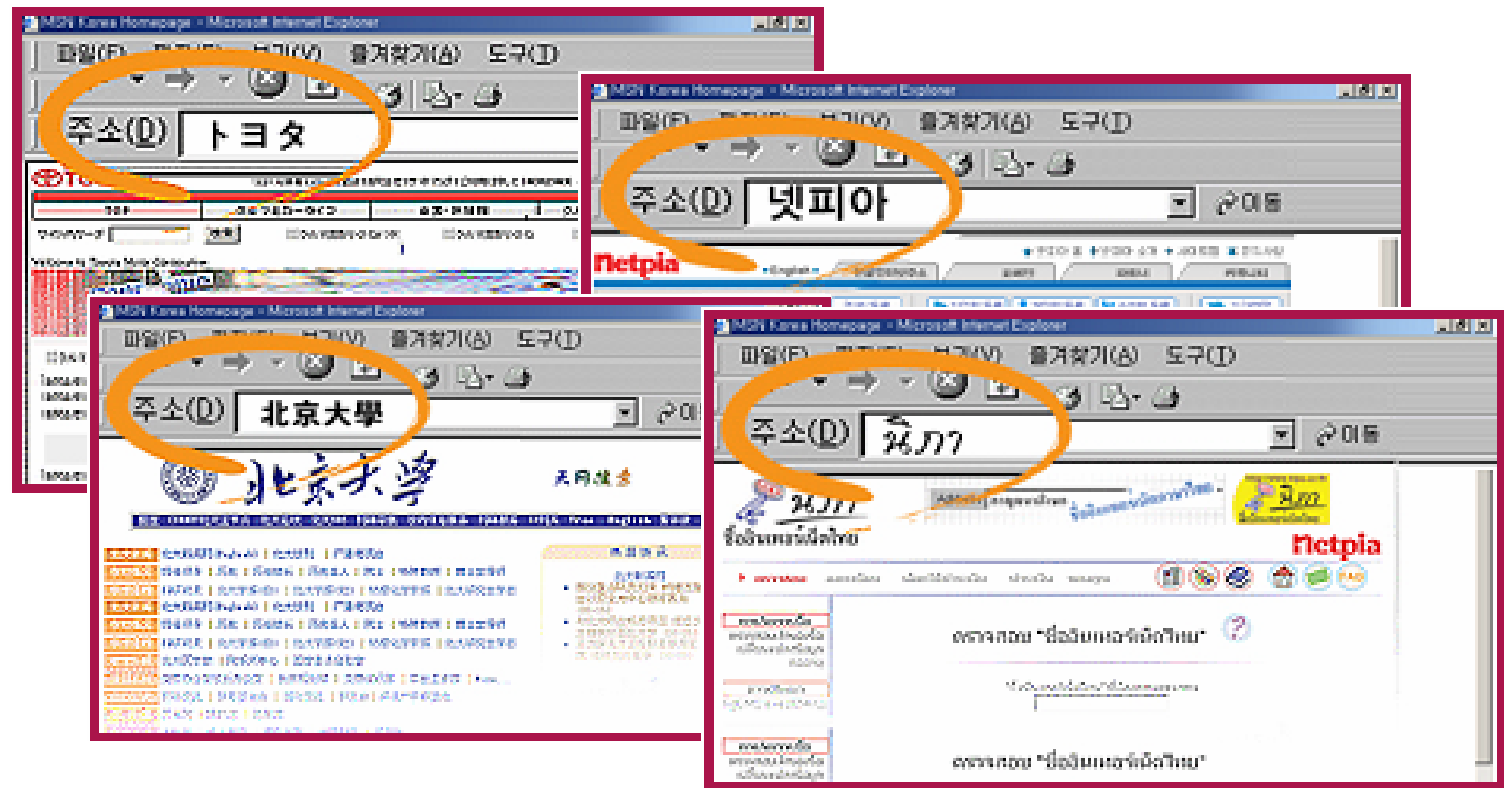
What UN WGIG is saying ...
